



Second Annual Mentorship Programme a Great Success

The second Annual Mentorship session for all students under the KenGen Scholarship Programme ends today with the award of scholarships to the 2015 intake.

The three-day programme commenced on August 16. Keeping up with last year's successful session, this year's mentorship schedule was designed by top trainers for individual classes from Form 1 to Form 4, with university students taking their own sessions.

Over the last three days, the students

participated in group lectures, interactive meetings and team building sessions facilitated by specialised trainers. They were guided through an in-depth confidence training exercise within an environment that encouraged peer relationships, networking, and the exchange of ideas and experiences.

The students were also treated to motivational seminars by successful role models from various companies and education foundations. The participants sought and received life advice, built

strong alliances, and set out education and career strategies.

The lectures, materials, assessments, and executive guidance delivered through the programme are of tremendous value to the future development of the students.

The programme attracts leading professionals at the top of their fields to deliver lectures and workshops, creating a platform that encourages the students towards becoming transformational leaders of tomorrow by interacting and learning

from the great leaders of today.

The Annual Mentorship Programme is an integral component of the KenGen Foundation's Education pillar.

The programme is now being broadened to include mentors from KenGen staff, who have volunteered their services free of charge through the Employee Giver Initiative introduced by the Foundation earlier this year.

The Founding of KenGen Foundation

Since its formal establishment in 1997, KenGen has been involved in Corporate Social Responsibility activities, specifically targeting communities living in areas neighbouring its installations. This corporate effort has been driven by the Company's commitment to add value to the livelihoods of communities by working with them towards implementing sustainable projects.

The effort has also been sustained by the company's realisation that it cannot operate in isolation of the environment around it, which includes communities, natural resources and various other stakeholders.

Two-and-a-half years ago, the Company established the KenGen Foundation to act as a vehicle for up-scaling the Corporate Social Investment programmes. Among the key pillars of the Foundation was education, whose support KenGen had sought to expand in as much as resources would allow.

The Foundation was registered in March 2012 and began operations in December of the same year. It is run by a Managing Trustee and governed by a Board of Trustees.

The key objective of the Foundation is to implement a focused, strategic expansion of KenGen's Corporate Social Investment and to mobilise additional resources to enable more sustainable projects.

Every year, KenGen continues with its custom of offering annual scholarships to students across the country, in particular from areas neighbouring the company's installations. The scholarships are awarded to high school and university students. The Company also gives infrastructural support to education institutions all over the country.

Environment

KenGen actively contributes towards environmental conservation initiatives, such as mitigation on the effects of climate change, particularly for communities whose livelihoods are heavily dependent on rainfall, conservation of biodiversity, and promotion of environmental awareness. This is done through various projects, including the Green Initiative Challenge (GIC) that targets primary and secondary school students to spread a culture of growing trees and conserving natural resources.

Water and Sanitation

Every year, preventable waterborne illnesses claim the lives of millions of Kenyans. Through partnerships with corporates, central and county governments, KenGen has contributed towards addressing Kenya's water challenges through provision of clean accessible water to communities.

he KenGen Foundation has now listed and contacted all the past students who have gone through the Scholarship Programme, and will soon launch the Scholarships Alumni Association. This group will spearhead the contribution of the former students towards giving back to the society through the Foundation.

The alumni will be meeting in September to formally

set up an association and chart the way forward towards their own 'Giving' programme.
